Medical tourism – also called health tourism – is a huge and booming industry spanning the entire globe.

(A) In 2020, the value of the global health tourism sector was around US\$54 billion, but by 2027 it is expected to almost quadruple in size to US\$207 billion.

BMedical tourism is as old as time itself. People in ancient societies were known to travel great distances to seek the \*expertise of physicians and spiritual healers in other parts of the world. In early modern society, patients would make long journeys to \*spa towns, where they could receive medical treatments in hospitals and get well in peace.

Today, here are many reasons someone might become a medical tourist, from the cost and ( $\mathcal{T}$ ) of treatment to gaining access to treatments that are not widely ( $\mathcal{T}$ ) in your home country. Medical tourism can combine medical treatments with a holiday, and many are now also choosing to spend their time working abroad online.

So, what is medical tourism? Medical tourism, <u>Cootherwise</u> known as health tourism, is when people travel for medical treatment to another country. It's a (ウ) that has been growing rapidly since the COVID-19 pandemic, with the global medical tourism market planned to grow at an annual rate of 15-25% over the next decade.

It is often associated with people from lesser-developed countries with poorer health systems traveling to more advanced countries to receive high-quality medical care. Patients may also choose to travel to countries that specialize in the type of treatment they need.

That said, with the cost of healthcare increasing \*exponentially in recent years, medical tourism has started (3)[1. become 2. common 3. for 4. more 5. people 6. to ] in developed countries, who travel to less-developed countries to receive low-cost medical treatments. Indeed, patients from countries that don't have a universal health system can often save thousands of dollars on medical treatments by traveling abroad, making medical tourism an ( $\bot$ ) option for people who are \*uninsured or \*underinsured, as well as for ( $\updownarrow$ ) who have reached their insurance \*coverage limit in their home country.

Many medical tourists now also go ( 1 ) elective and cosmetic treatments such as \*plastic surgery, \*hair transplants, or \*cosmetic dental procedures.

The cost savings speak for themselves – the OECD points out that a \*heart valve treatment costing US\$150,000 in America may only cost US\$9,250 in Poland. (3), a growing number of patients not only from the US but also from other developed countries are traveling abroad with the purpose of obtaining low-cost health care, including elective surgery and long-term care.

This trend is not \*innocuous. It can lead developing countries to emphasize technology-intensive third care for foreigners (4) basic health care for their citizens. (5), it can \*exacerbate the brain drain from the public to the private sector.

You can see the examples in Thailand and India where \*distorting effects of this trend can be seen in the distribution of scarce resources.
